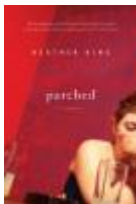

Born and raised on the New Hampshire seacoast, she did a 10-year law stint in Boston and moved to L.A. in 1990. Today King concentrates on her writing and is a commentator for National Public Radio's "All Things Considered." Her work has appeared in numerous magazines and journals. King is the author of *Parched*, a story about her bout with alcoholism. Her second book, *Pulse*, will be published in early of 2008.
