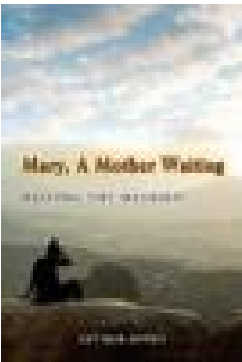
In *Full of Grace: Encountering Mary in Faith, Art and Life*, Judith Dupre
