If you read and have been discussing with friends and colleagues the article from The Economist, "[Earthly concerns](#)," [1] about the royal mess U.S. church finances are in, you need to be reading Mark Gray's excellent postings on [Nineteen Sixty-four](#) [2], a research blog for the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University.

Read down to the update, where Gray re-runs some of The Economist's figures:

The story overestimates annual Catholic Church offertory by \$4.6 billion or 50% because they assume Mass-attending individuals give an average of \$10 per week (for data see pg. 43) rather than households.
