

## Thomas Reese

Father Reese entered the Jesuits in 1962 and was ordained in 1974. He was educated at St. Louis University, the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley, and at the University of California Berkeley, where he received a Ph.D. in political science. He worked in Washington as a [writer](#) [2] and lobbyist for tax reform from 1975 to 1978. He was an associate editor of [America](#) [3] magazine, where he wrote on politics, economics and the Catholic church, from 1978 to 1985 and editor-in-chief from 1998 to 2005. He was a senior fellow at the Woodstock Theological Center from 1985 to 1998 and 2006 to 2013. During the summers, he works as a visiting scholar at the [Markkula Center for Applied Ethics](#) [4] at Santa Clara University.

While at Woodstock, he wrote the trilogy on the organization and politics of the church: *Archbishop: Inside the Power Structure of the American Catholic Church* (1989), *A Flock of Shepherds: The National Conference of Catholic Bishops* (1992), and [Inside the Vatican: The Politics and Organization of the Catholic Church](#) [5] (1996). He also edited *The Universal Catechism Reader* (1990), an analysis of the first draft of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, and *Episcopal Conferences: Historical, Canonical and Theological Studies* (1989). He is also author of a NCR eBook, [Caring for Our Common Home: A Readers? Guide and Commentary on Pope Francis? Encyclical on the Environment](#) [6] (2015).

In 2014, Father Reese was appointed by President Obama to the [U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom](#) [7], an independent, bipartisan U.S. federal government commission that reviews the facts and circumstances of religious freedom violations and makes policy recommendations to the President, the Secretary of State, and Congress. He was reappointed to another two-year term in May 2016, and he was elected to a one-year term as chair of the commission in June 2016. His writings for the NCR do not necessarily reflect the views of the commission.

Father Reese began writing for the NCR during the 2013 conclave. He is based in Washington, DC.
