After 42 years of itinerant ministry, Franciscan Fr. Richard Rohr is getting off the road.

"I decided years ago that if I'm going to keep teaching contemplation, then the last years of my life should be contemplative," Rohr said in an interview at the Center for Action and Contemplation (CAC), a program he founded 25 years ago in Albuquerque, N.M.

"It's not that I'm retiring," said Rohr, who turned 70 in March. "If God continues to give me health and a sane mind and verbal ability, I want to teach," but it will only be in and around New Mexico. 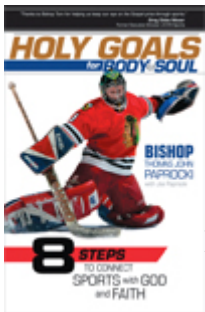
Baseball's touch of the ineffable
