5. Pot still boils in Rome while Francis is away by John L. Allen Jr., published July 26. Although he was with Pope Francis in Rio de Janeiro for World Youth Day, Allen had plenty to say about what Pope Francis would face when he returned home.

1. Pope on homosexuals: 'Who am I to judge?' by John L. Allen Jr., posted July 29. Of course the story everyone's talking about was the most popular on the site this month. Pope Francis told reporters aboard the papal plane on his trip home from Rio, "When I meet a gay person, I have to distinguish between their being gay and being part of a lobby. If they accept the Lord and have goodwill, who am I to judge them?"
