Omar Pro Montaña looked into sending his daughter to Catholic school years ago, but he couldn't afford the then \$5,200 tuition at St. John the Evangelist Catholic School in Tucson.

"If I was financially set, it would have been a no-brainer," Pro Montaña said. "I would have gone with a little less to make sure she went."

But at that time, Pro Montaña was in school so that he could take care of his family. He is a barber and his wife is a prep cook, and money has always been tight for the family of five.
